

"Historische Diskurssemantik [...] entwirft das Szenario des kollektiven Wissens einer gegebenen Diskursgemeinschaft in einer gegebenen Epoche hinsichtlich des zum Untersuchungsgegenstand erwählten thematischen Bereichs bzw. des Bedeutungsfeldes bzw. der Diskursformation. [...] Die Beschreibung des kollektiven Wissens kann immer nur erfolgen hinsichtlich eines zum Gegenstand gemachten Diskursbereiches; nur für diesen werden die epistemischen Bedingungen, angeschlossenen Bedeutungsfelder, thematischen Vorläufer, verworfenen, aber dennoch präsenten Gegenentwürfe, paradigmatischen Voraussetzungen etc. zu formulieren versucht. Das Szenario beschreibt somit immer nur das Umfeld eines einzelnen Bereichs, es kann nicht das gesammelte Wissen einer Epoche erfassen."


